Welcome Review Agenda	Meeting opened at 10:15	One correction made to the minutes from July 2008 minutes. By using plastic id cards it will save \$500,000 dollars a year, not \$5,000 as stated in the minutes.		
Review of Minutes from July 2008 meeting	Reviewed minutes from the July 2008 meeting. Minutes were approved with one correction. During the July 29 th meeting clarification was requested on three topics: 1. Medical coverage for women who have recently delivered and lose custody of the child. New mothers remain covered for benefits for two months post partum. When a child is removed from physical custody there is a temporary absent policy in place. When the child is removed from maternal custody the mother may lose benefits. This is a barrier to the child returning to the home. In addition; follow-up care post-partum needs may not have had the opportunity to present such as with post-partum depression. July 29 th meeting clarification continued	Information was requested regarding how many bilingual staff is at the Clearinghouse. 3. What is the percent of Medicaid dollars spent on long-term care (LTC)?	1. New mothers remain covered for benefits for two months post partum. KFMAM: A child or caretaker who remains a part of the household, but is, or is expected to be, out of the home for 180 consecutive days or less, shall, if otherwise eligible, qualify to receive assistance. In addition, a caretaker who is out of the home for employment or to fulfill a work requirement shall also qualify as a part of the household regardless of the length of time away. A child who is out of the home for a temporary visit with the non custodial parent and who is expected to return within 180 days shall remain on the custodial parent's medical case and CSE (if MA CM) shall be notified of the absence. Note: A child may be out of the home for purposes such as visiting the absent parent or vacation. Even though the caretaker's responsibility for care and control is lost, as long as the absence is less than 180 days, they are still considered a caretaker. 2. Percentage of staff at the Clearinghouse who are bilingual: 10% of State staff, 25% of Customer Service and 17% of Eligibility staff. Dr. Curtis recommends that the percent of eligibility staff that are bilingual be increased. KHPA will check into the training provided to new staff at the Clearinghouse and what the turnover rate is for these staff. 3. 14.66 percent of Medicaid dollars are spent in LTC.

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Update on Transition to plastic cards	Transition of the plastic id cards went smoothly. In September 275,000 cards were mailed. Beneficiaries, pharmacies and providers are adjusting to the plastic id card change.	
Title 19 and Title 21: How they are different and compare to each other.	Chris English shared with the Board a presentation titled HealthWave 101. The presentation included what is HealthWave, a brief history of HealthWave, HealthWave population state fiscal year (SFY) 2008, what is stair-step eligibility, how much family income is allowed, HealthWave service regions, and who are the managed care organizations. The presentation also compared and showed the differences between Title 19 and 21.	A copy of the presentation will be attached to the minutes.
3. Bone Growth Stimulators	Kim Brink presented information on bone growth stimulators. Bone stimulators are a class III device. There are implantable devices which are implanted in surgery, non invasive devices, and ultrasound devices. KHPA is a member of the Hayes group. The Hayes group does research on studies. They give a comparison and then a rating based on the studies. They give A, B, C, or D ratings. The implantable devices were given a C rating (potential but unproven benefit) for the spinal fusion and a D rating for use on nonunion factures of appendicular bones. A D rating is no proven benefit and/or not safe. The noninvasive devices the rating was C, with one B and D. A lot of insurance companies do cover bone growth stimulators but must be prior authorized.	Passed unanimously to not cover bone growth stimulators.
