Dental	Members 21 yrs. and older receive \$500 per year for dental services. It can be used for things like dental exams/cleanings twice each year, annual bitewing X-rays, fillings and extractions, specific root canals (anterior and bicuspid/pre-molar), and topical fluoride treatments. Member incentives include Activity Book and up to \$25 gift cards (up to \$75 annually) for meeting identified goals. Members ages 5 to 18 can get up to \$50 per year for activities at participating YMCA, Boys and Girls Clubs, Boy Scouts or Girl Scouts. Through iFoster we will provide a tablet to youth ages 13 to 17 and a notebook computer for ages 18 to 24 along with digital literacy training and access to a large number of supportive online resources for supporting existing youths in foster care. Foster youth in transition will receive a duffle bag filled with personal hygiene items, supplies and a blanket to assist with their transition another location.
