

Immigration Status Job Aid

Note: Use applicant's statement when answering questions below; do not require that applicant provide verification of legal immigration status.

1.	Does the applicant state that they have an eligible immigration status?	If yes, go to Step 2.	If no, the applicant is not eligible.
2.	 Is the applicant a Lawful Permanent Resident who meets one of the following criteria? Citizen of the Marshall Islands, Micronesia, and Palau Lawful Permanent Resident (green-card holders or LPRs who adjusted to LPR from an immigration status that is exempt from the 5-year bar) Refugee Asylee Deportation withheld Cuban Haitian Entrant Amerasian immigrant Victim of trafficking Afghani or Iraqi special immigrant Member of a federally recognized Indian tribe or American Indian born in Canada An honorably discharged veteran or active- duty US military member A spouse or unmarried dependent child of a veteran or active-duty service member Have lived in the US since 1996 	If yes, the applicant meets immigration status requirements.	If no, go to Step 3.
3.	 Was the applicant legally admitted with one of the following statuses? Lawful Permanent Resident Battered non-citizens and their children or parents Paroled into the U.S. for at least one year Conditional Entrant prior to April 1, 1980 	If yes, the applicant meets immigration status requirements. (5-year bar)	If no, the applicant is not eligible.

Notes:

Applicants who do not meet these immigration status requirements may be eligible for SOBRA (Sixth Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act) if they meet all other eligibility criteria.
