

Presumptive Eligibility

Presumptive Eligibility is a program designed to provide individuals in targeted populations with **immediate** and **temporary** medical coverage.

The PE program serves the following populations in Kansas:

- Children
- Pregnant Women
- Adults in one of the following groups:
 - 1. Low-income Caretakers
 - 2. Former Foster Care Individuals
 - 3. Breast or Cervical Cancer recipients diagnosed through the EDW program



 To provide individuals with temporary medical coverage while the household completes the KanCare application and eligibility process.

 To increase enrollment of children, pregnant women, and low-income adults in ongoing medical benefits.






PE Process Overview

An uninsured individual presents to the facility for a medical service.

The PE Specialist meets with the individual/family to conduct a screening to determine if there is potential eligibility for Medicaid.

If potential eligibility exists, PE Specialist completes the Presumptive Eligibility application for temporary coverage in a Web-based portal with the individual.

The KanCare application is submitted with the Presumptive Eligibility application.




Presumptive Eligibility

 The KanCare Clearinghouse completes a full medical determination.

 If eligible, coverage will continue under a full KanCare program.

 If determined ineligible, Presumptive Eligibility coverage will end.





PE Benefits

- o All children and adults are assigned an MCO of their choice
- Pregnant women are fee for service while on PE coverage.
- All services that are usually covered under the full KanCare benefit package are covered during the Presumptive Eligibility period.
- Individuals will have access to other Medicaid providers to receive needed follow-up care.
- Facilities will receive regular reimbursement rates for services they provide regardless of the final medical determination of the applicant.

PE Specialists


Presumptive Eligibility Specialist have a very important role that continues through final processing of the full KanCare Application if appointed as a facilitator by the applicant.


- Assist households with submitting any required documentation to the Clearinghouse.
- Receive copies of requests for additional verification or information that is requested of the household.
- Contact the Clearinghouse when questions arise regarding a specific case or how it was determined.
- Serve as a bridge between PE families and the Clearinghouse.
