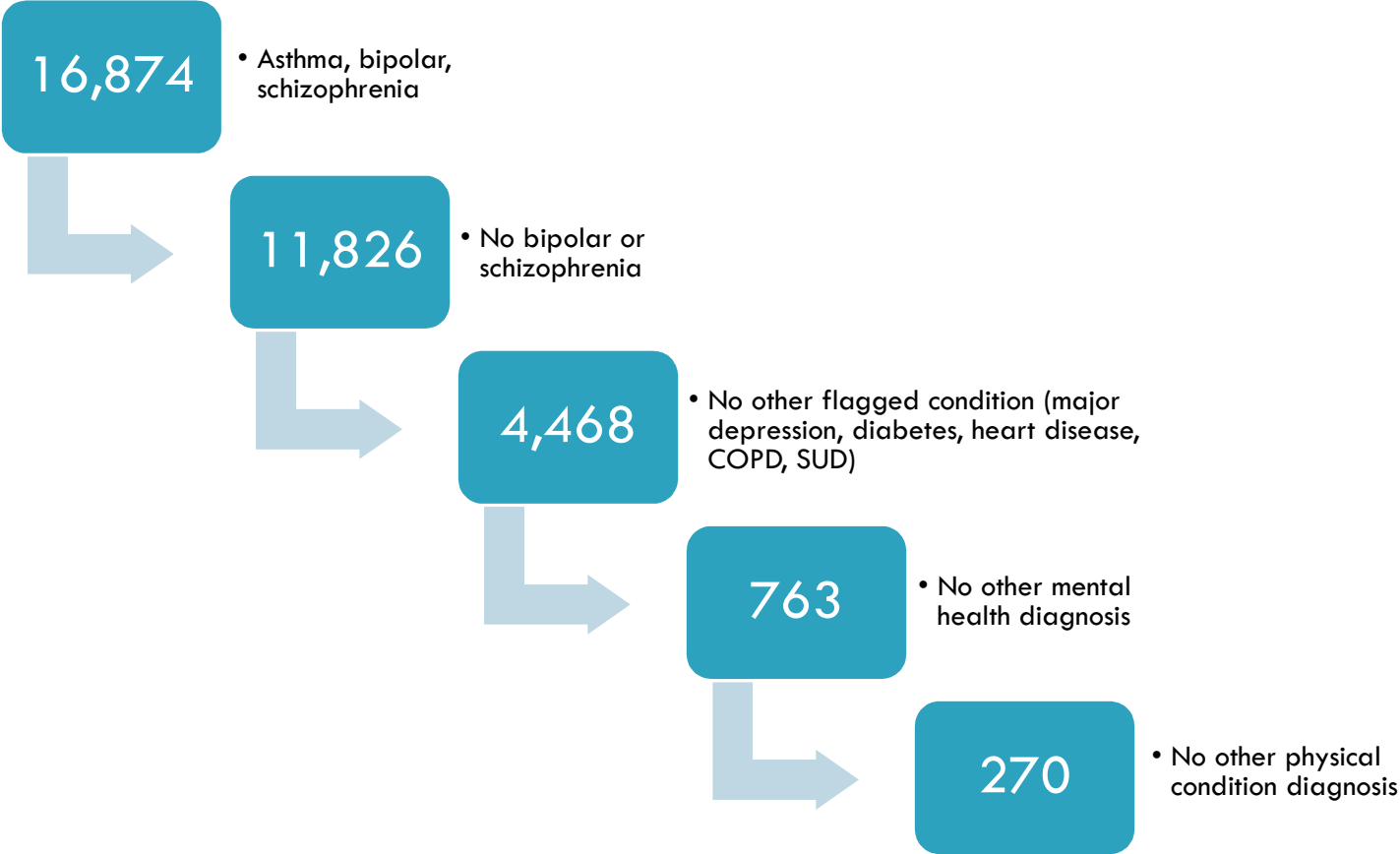

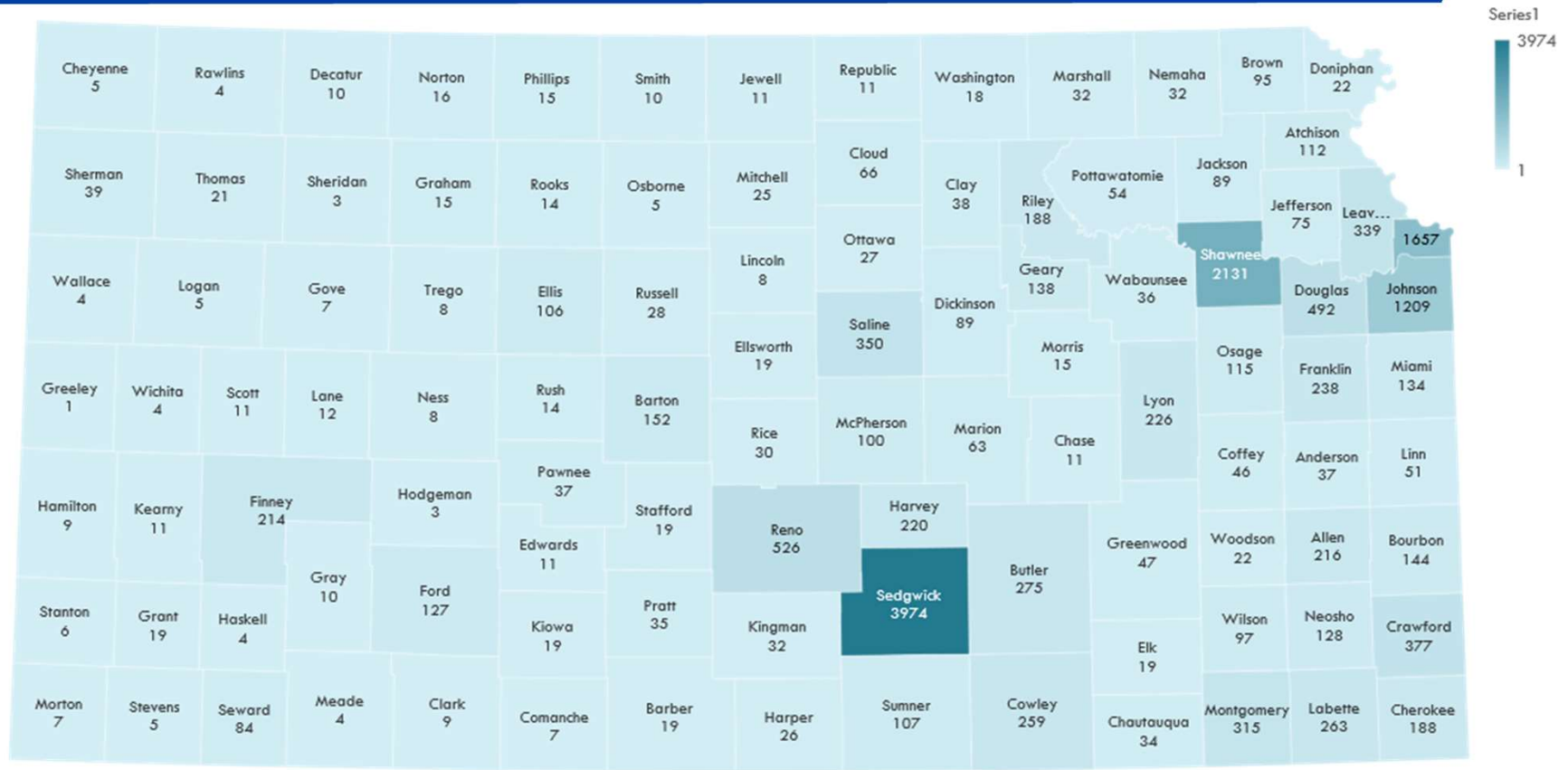

Breakdown of the Target Population



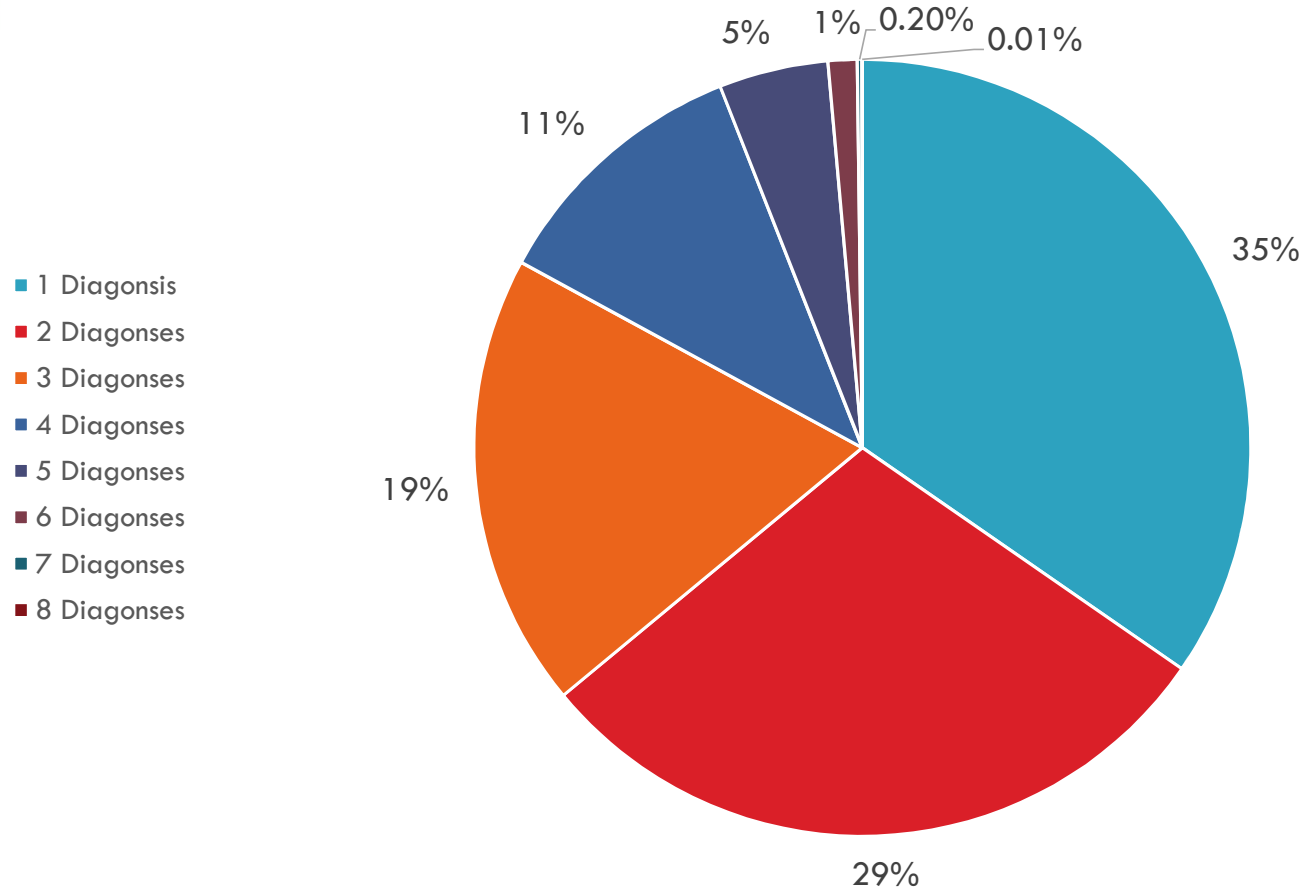
Target Population: Counts by County

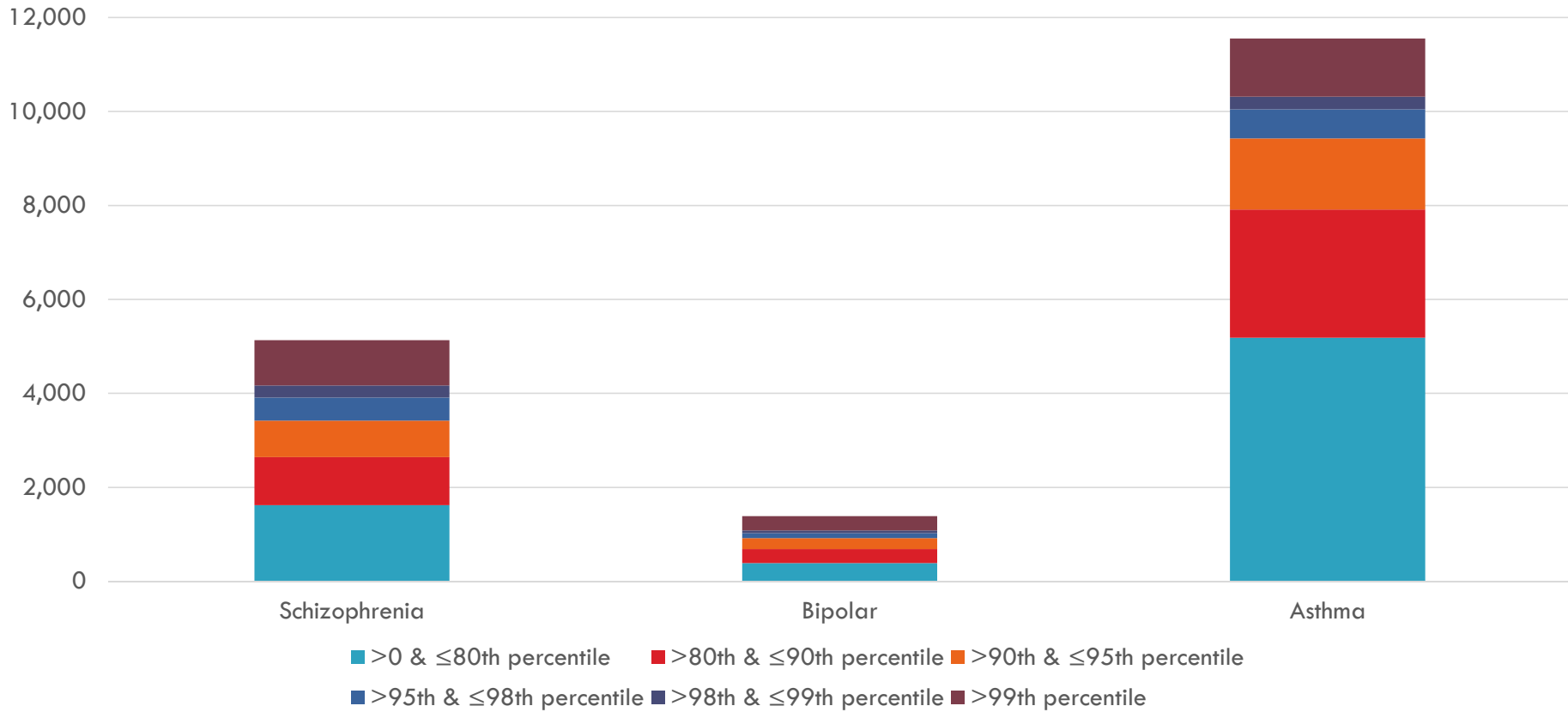
Percentage of Target Population with Multiple Diagnoses



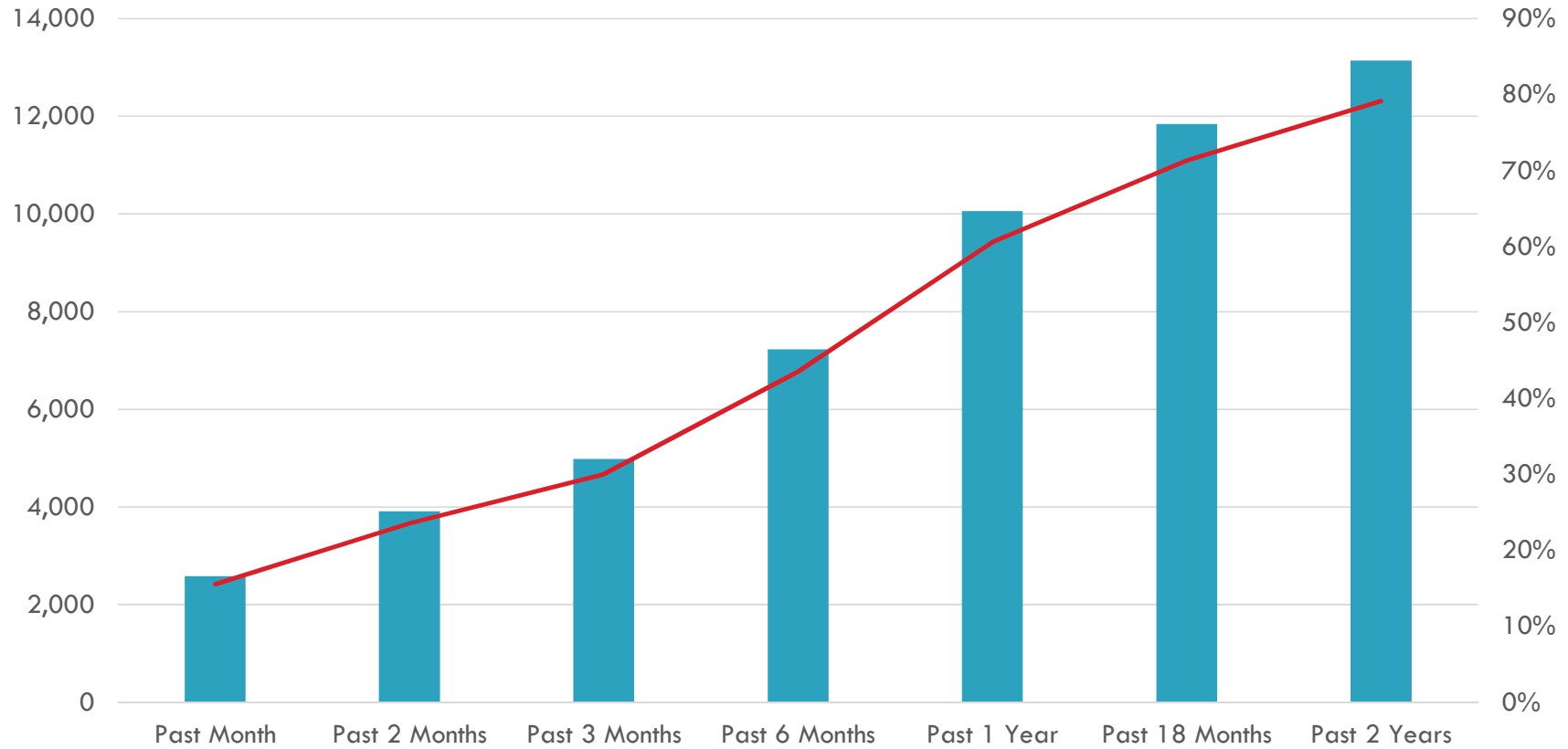

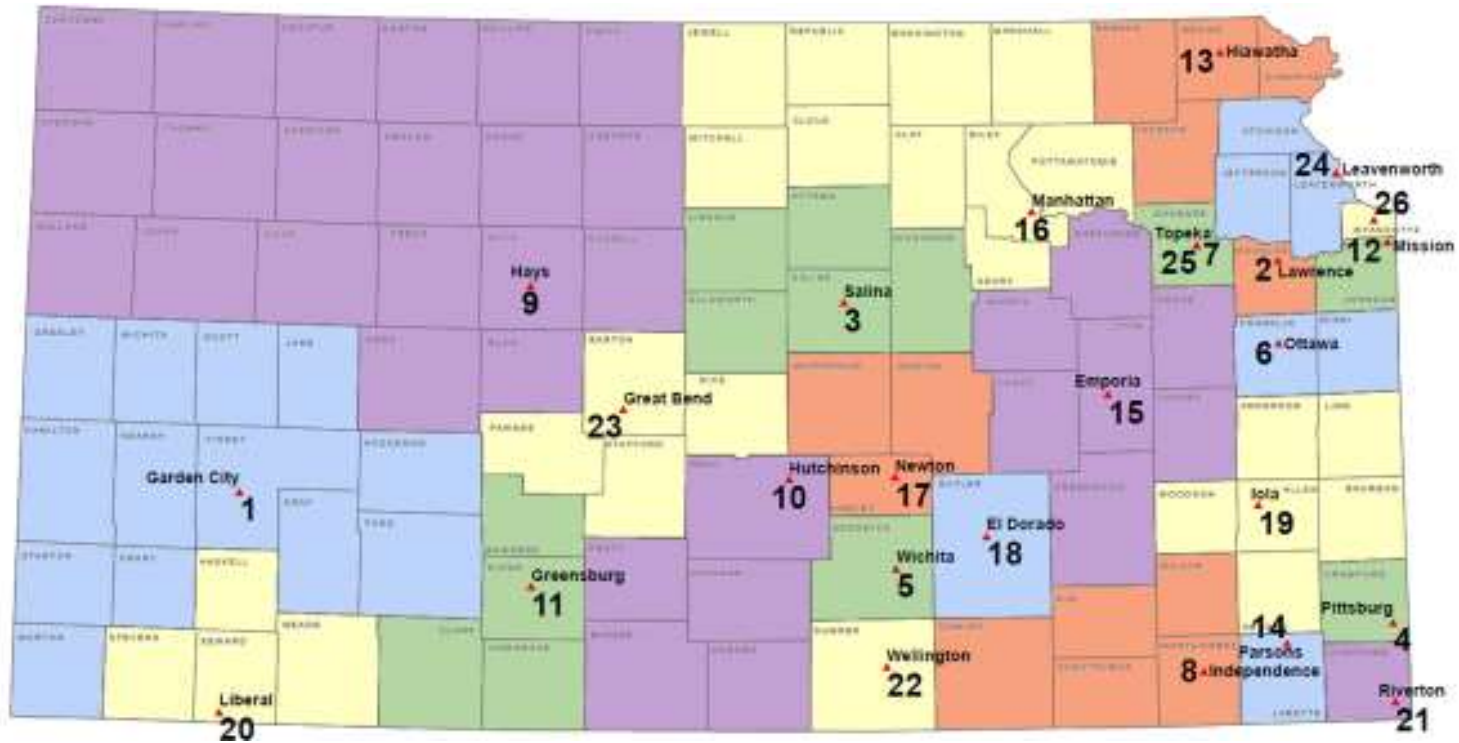
Select Conditions by Cost Category (Total Population)



Target Population: Time Since Inclusion Criteria Met



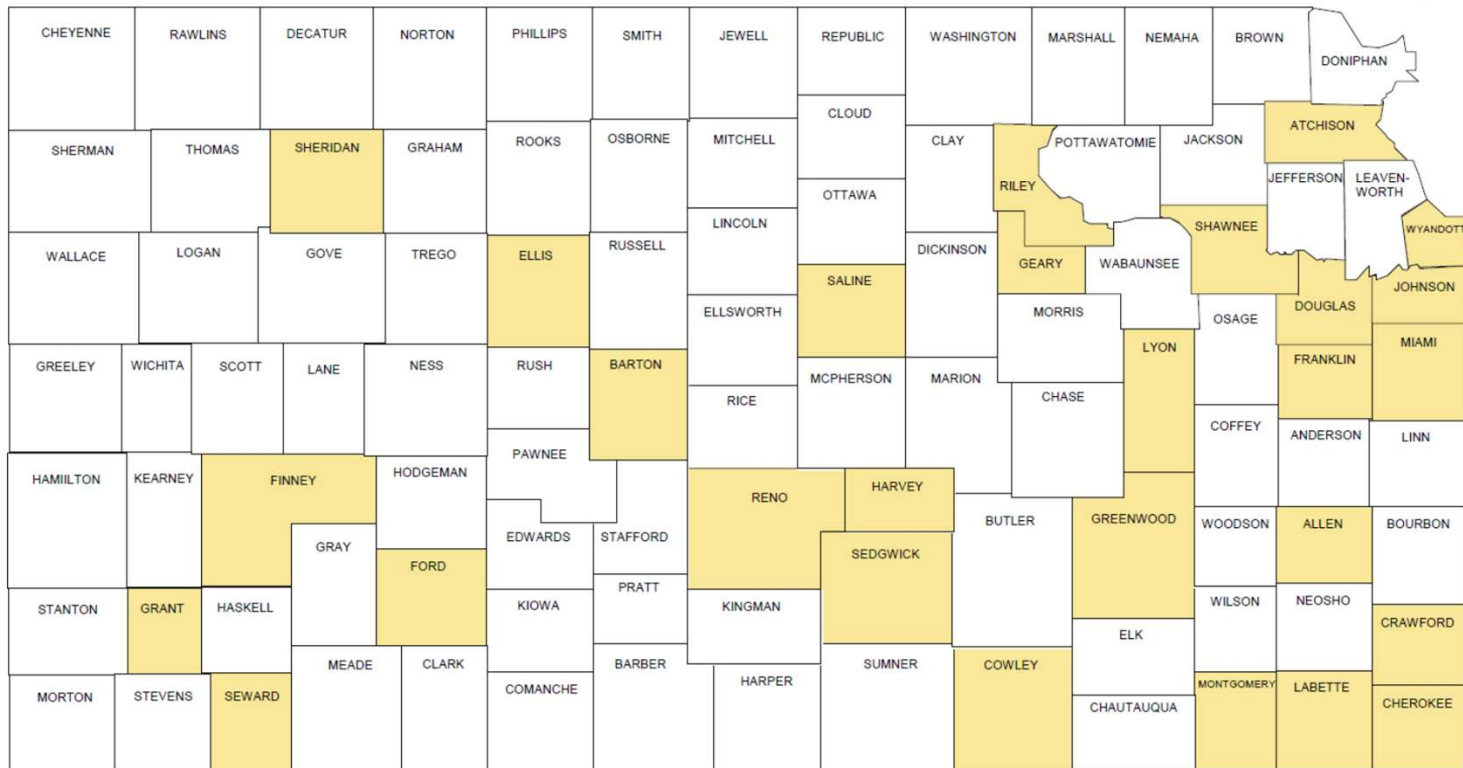

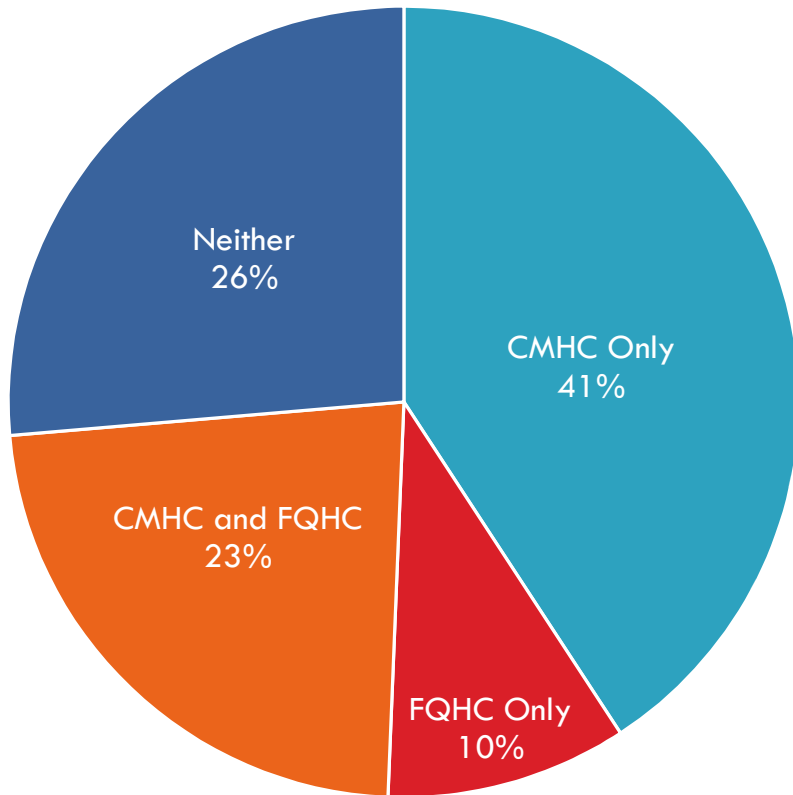

Target Population Connection to CMHC or FQHC (any year)



Of those who have ever been to a CMHC, 31.4% have been in the last year.

Of those who have ever been to an FQHC, 47.5% have been in the last year.

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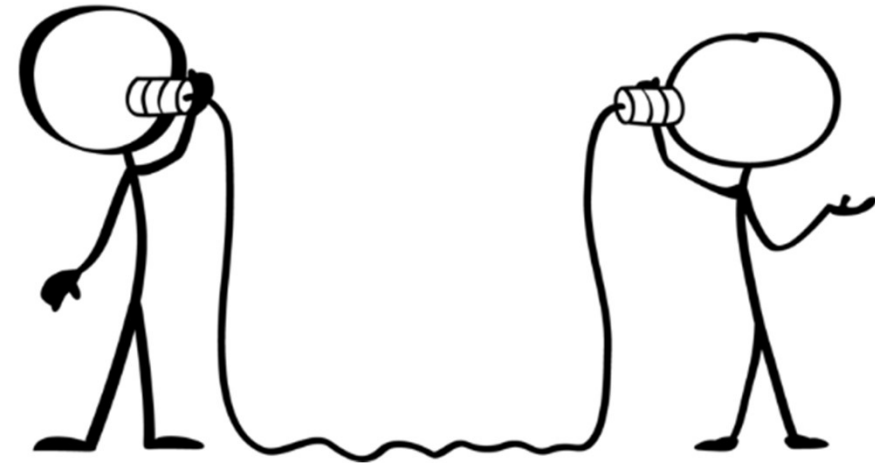
