


Feedback






Breakdown of the Target Population





Target Population: Counts by County








Select Conditions by Cost Category (Total Population)






Target Population: Time Since Inclusion Criteria Met









Target Population Connection to CMHC or FQHC (any year)



Of those who have ever been to a CMHC, 31.4% have been in the last year.

Of those who have ever been to an FQHC, 47.5% have been in the last year.

Asthma

ICD10 codes that start with J453-J459 (Mild- Moderate persistent asthma) ICD9 codes that start with 49392 (asthma with acute exacerbation)

Schizophrenia

ICD10 codes that start with F20 (Paranoid schizophrenia) ICD9 codes that start with 295 (Paranoid schizophrenia)

Bipolar

ICD10 codes that start with

F3163 (Bipolar disorder, current episode mixed, severe, without psychotic features)

F3164 (Bipolar disorder, current episode mixed, severe, with psychotic features)

F3113 (Bipolar affective disorder, manic, severe)

F312 (Bipolar affective disorder, manic, severe, with psychotic behavior)

29643 (Bipolar affective disorder, manic, severe)

29644 (Bipolar affective disorder, manic, severe, with psychotic behavior)


