



## **Kansas Medical Assistance Fact Sheet: Medical Coverage for Parents and Caregivers or Children**

### **GENERAL REQUIREMENTS**

This program is available to families with children. There must be children in the home under the age of 19. This program may cover the children and their parents who live together. If the children are living with other relatives or legal guardians, this program may cover the children and the other relatives or legal guardians.

To be eligible, a household member must be a Kansas resident and a U.S. citizen or an eligible non-citizen. Verification of citizenship and identity or immigration status is required. See the Citizenship and Identity Requirements fact sheet for more information.

### **RESOURCES**

No resource test is applicable.

### **INCOME**

The earned and unearned income of the child and the adults they are living with must be considered. This includes wages, unemployment benefits, and Social Security (except SSI) to name a few.

The application should list each person who is living in the home. The eligibility worker will decide who will be counted in the household based on the rules of the program.

### **INCOME STANDARDS**

The income standard varies depending on the family size. Your family size is usually determined by your income tax unit. Your family size may also include your parents if you are a minor or they claim you as a tax dependent.

If the family income exceeds the maximum income limit for this program, the children can then be considered for coverage under the children's medical program (see fact sheet Medical Coverage for Children for additional information).

### **COOPERATION WITH CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (CSS)**

Parents and caretakers approved for the family medical program are required to cooperate with the Child Support Services department of DCF to obtain child support for the children in the home. If you are afraid to seek child support because there is a fear that the absent parent will harm you or the child, you should contact KanCare when you apply.

**How to Apply for Medical Coverage:** You must complete and submit an application to receive medical coverage.

To apply for medical coverage, use any of the following choices:
